Triple A World Junior Golf Series Brief

The Triple A World Junior Golf Series follows a similar structure and system to that of the Fedex cup and the Race to Dubai on the PGA and European Tours respectively, in that each tournament in the series will offer its participants the opportunity to earn points which accumulate into the Triple A Series Order of Merit.

The amount of points earned is dependent on the importance of the tournament (Triple A 500 tournament, Series Major or Series Final) and the finish position achieved in the tournament.

The top 60 participants in the order of merit will qualify for the Triple A World Series Final where they will have an opportunity to be crowned Triple A World Series Champion and/or Triple A World Series Final Winner, very similar to that of the Tour Championship on the PGA Tour.

Tournaments

The Series will consist of 3 types of Tournament:

1) Triple A Series 500 Tournaments

- 2 day, 36 hole tournaments - **Winners earn 500 Order of Merit Points.**



2) Triple A World Series WAGR Majors

- Triple A European Masters
 - Triple A European Championship
 - Triple A European Open
- 3 day, 54 hole WAGR Tournaments - **Winners earn 2,500 Order of Merit Points.**



3) Triple A World Series Final

- Top 60 & ties in the Order of Merit Qualify
- 3 day, 54 hole WAGR Tournament -
- Winners earn 4,000 points.**



Participants

The competition is open to all golfers in possession of the corresponding golf license from the Royal Spanish Golf Federation or a handicap certificate from their countries golf federation. Eligible players are those born on 1998 and later with a maximum handicap of 24 on the day of registration.

Categories

Triple A 500 Tournaments:

- U21 Mixed - Mens and Women's
- U16 Mixed - Boys and Girls
- U12 Mixed - Boys and Girls

Triple A World Series Majors:

- U21 - Mens (WAGR)
- U21 - Womens (WAGR)
- U16 Mixed - Boys and Girls (Not WAGR)
- U12 Mixed - Boys and Girls (Not WAGR)

Triple A World Series Final:

- U21 - Mens (WAGR)
- U21 - Womens (WAGR)
- U16 Mixed - Boys and Girls (Not WAGR)
- U12 Mixed - Boys and Girls (NOT WAGR)

Rules

The competition will be played according to the golf rules as approved and applied by the R&A and USGA.

Tournament Conditions, local Golf Course rules and additional rules put into force by the tournament committee will apply.

Format

All Triple A World Junior Golf Series Tournaments will be Medal/Stroke Play format.

Triple A 500 Tournaments:

- 2 day, 36 Hole Medal Play Tournaments with no cut.

Triple A World Series Majors:

- U21 and U16 Categories

- 3 day, 54 Hole Medal Play Tournaments with 36 hole cut of 70% of the field and ties.

- U12 Categories

- 2 day, 36 Hole Medal Play Tournaments with no cut.

Triple A World Series Final:

- U21 and U16 Categories

- 3 day, 54 Hole Medal Play Tournament with 36 hole cut of 70% of the field and ties.

- U12 Categories

- 2 day, 36 Hole Medal Play Tournament with no cut.

Registration

All registrations need to be received by the JFGA at least two (2) weeks before tournament day 1. The registrations and field will be administered by the JFGA and published the day before the tournaments along with round 1 and round 2 Tee Times.

Tournament Entry Fees

The Entry fees will be determined by the JFGA and paid to the Academy.

Cancelation

Triple A 500 Tournaments

- Cancelations made within 48 hours prior to the first tee time on day 1 will not be refunded.

Triple A Series Majors and Triple A World Series Final

- Cancelations made within 2 weeks prior to the first tee time on day 1 will not be refunded.

Field Sizes

Triple A 500 Tournaments & Triple A Series Majors

The maximum field size for the 2 day Triple A 500 Tournaments and the 3 day Triple A WAGR Major Tournaments will be the sum of all the categories and should not exceed 90 players.

Triple A World Series Final

The maximum field size for the Triple A World Series Final will be 60 players and will consist of the top 60 in the order of merit.

***The Order of Merit Top 60 will be made up of:**

- Top 20 & ties U21 boys,
- Top 15 & ties U21 Girls
- Top 20 & ties U16 Mixed
- Top 6 and ties U12 Mixed

*6 participants are required to confirm a category.

Start times and groups

Triple A 500 Tournaments

- Day 1 - Groups will be organised in Handicap and category order with oldest categories and lowest handicaps teeing off first.

- Day 2 - Groups will be organised in leaderboard order.

Triple A Series Majors and Triple A World Series Final

- Days 1 and 2 - Groups will be organised in Handicap and category order with the older categories and lowest handicaps exiting first. Early tee times day 1 will go out later on day 2 and vice versa.
- Day 3 - Groups will be organised in leaderboard order.

Tees

Teeing grounds for each category will be organised and decided by the tournaments committee.

Trophies and Prizes

The JFGA will award prizes to the following finish positions:

- 3 Best Scratch players U21 (Boys and Girls)
- 3 Best Scratch and Handicap players U16 (mixed)
- 3 Best Scratch and Handicap U12 Scratch (mixed)

*In the event of a tie for 1st place, a sudden death play off will take place. 2nd and 3rd places will be decided on count back.

Committee

The committee will be made up of all JFGA members of staff.

Caddies

Caddies are not allowed in any category except in the U12.

Buggies

The use of buggies is not permitted for players or caddies. .

Technical equipment

A player can use a device (GPS/Laser) to obtain information with regards to distance using technical equipment that measures exclusively distance.

If during a round a player is found using a device that is designed to also calculate or measure any other condition and information that could affect his game (elevation, wind speed, temperature etc) the player is in breach with rule 14-3. The penalty will be 2 shots on the first time and disqualification if repeated.

Parent Viewing Area

Due to a number of incidents in past tournaments where parents of participants were getting too involved with the tournament play, we have made the decision to not allow parents to walk the course during the tournament days. Instead, we have designated parents viewing areas which will be located on the:

- 1st Tee
- 9th Green
- 10th Tee
- 18 Green

Breaches of this rule could lead to penalty shots and even disqualification.
