Triple A World Junior Golf Series Brief

- The Triple A Series is designed to offer junior golfers the opportunity to display their skills over a series of golf tournaments, allowing college coaches in the US to view a junior golfers performance over an extended period of time, matching that of an NCAA College Season.
- The Triple A World Junior Golf Series is a six tournament series involving order of merit point accumulation, concluding with the Triple A Series World Final, to determine the Triple A World Series Champion.
- The Series consists of 6 three day (54 hole) WAGR ranked tournaments with U21 Boys, U21 Girls categories.
- The Series utilises some of Europes best courses, all located around the Sotogrande area in the south of Spain. Some of the courses include:
 - San Roque Old Course
 - San Roque New Course
 - Real Club de Golf Sotogrande
 - Club de Golf Finca Cortesin
- The Triple A World Series boasts a point accumulation system, working in a similar way to the season long race of the Fedex Cup and the Race to Dubai. Participants accumulate points in the Triple A Series Order of Merit depending on their finish position. The top 60 participants across all categories qualify for the Triple A Series World Final.
- The Series takes place between September and April, offering junior golfers the opportunity to play a full series of tournaments during the European winter season, before their Summer seasons kick off.

- 3 day, 54 hole WAGR Tournaments Winners earn 2,500 Order of Merit Points.



1 Triple A World Series Final

- Top 60 & ties in the Order of Merit Qualify
- 3 day, 54 hole WAGR Tournament -

Winners earn 4,000 points.



Participants

The competition is open to all golfers in possession of the corresponding golf license from the Royal Spanish Golf Federation or a handicap certificate from their countries golf federation. Eligible players are those born on 1998 and later with a maximum handicap of 24 on the day of registration.

Rules

The competition will be played according to the golf rules as approved and applied by the R&A and USGA.

Tournament Conditions, local Golf Course rules and additional rules put into force by the tournament committee will apply.

Format

All Triple A World Junior Golf Series Tournaments will be Medal/Stroke Play format.

Triple A World Series

- U21
 - 3 day, 54 Hole Medal Play Tournaments (There is no cut)

Triple A World Series Final:

- U21
 - 3 day, 54 Hole Medal Play Tournament (There is no cut)

Registration

All registrations need to be received by the JFGA at least two (2) weeks before tournament day 1. The registrations and field will be administered by the JFGA and published the day before the tournaments along with round 1 and round 2 Tee Times.

Tournament Entry Fees

The Entry fees will be determined by the JFGA and paid to the Academy.

Cancelation

- Cancelations made within 2 weeks prior to the first tee time on day 1 will not be refunded.

Field Sizes

Triple A Series

The maximum field size for the Triple A WAGR Tournaments will be the sum of all the categories and should not exceed 90 players.

Triple A World Series Final

The maximum field size for the Triple A World Series Final will be 60 players and will consist of the top 60 in the order of merit.

*The Order of Merit Top 60 will be made up of:

- Top 40 & ties U21 boys,
- Top 20 & ties U21 Girls

Start times and groups

Triple A Series and Triple A World Series Final

- Days 1 and 2 Groups will be organised in Handicap order with the older lowest handicaps exiting first. Early tee times day 1 will go out later on day 2 and vice versa.
- Day 3 Groups will be organised in leaderboard order.

Tees

Teeing grounds for each category will be organised and decided by the tournaments committee.

Trophies and Prizes

The JFGA will award prizes to the following finish positions:

- 3 Best Scratch players U21 (Boys and Girls)

*In the event of a tie for 1st place, a sudden death play off will take place. 2nd and 3rd places will be decided on count back.

Committee

The committee will be made up of all JFGA members of staff.

Caddies

Caddies are not allowed in any category

Buggies

The use of buggies is not permitted for players or caddies. .

Technical equipment

A player can use a device (GPS/Laser) to obtain information with regards to distance using technical equipment that measures exclusively distance.

If during a round a player is found using a device that is designed to also calculate or measure any other condition and information that could affect his game (elevation, wind speed, temperature etc) the player is in breach with rule 14-3. The penalty will be 2 shots on the first time and disqualification if repeated.
